

TORT AND MEDICAL MALPRACTICE CASES: A TINY PART OF OUR CIVIL JUSTICE SYSTEM

Many states (but not all) compile annual civil case filing and jury trial statistics, and provide their data to the National Center for State Courts (NCSC). Together, these data present the most accurate overview of our nation's state-based civil justice system. According to averages calculated from the most recent data released by NCSC (2015):

TORT CASES

Tort cases represent 3.8 percent of total state court civil caseloads.¹ This rate is consistent with NCSC data from the previous three years.²

MEDICAL MALPRACTICE CASES

- Medical malpractice cases represent 0.16 percent of all state *civil* caseloads.³ This rate is consistent with NCSC data from the previous three years.⁴
- Medical malpractice cases represent 4.6 percent of the total state *tort* caseloads.⁵ This rate is consistent with NCSC data from the previous three years.⁶

JURY TRIALS

- The percentage of *civil* cases resolved by jury trial in state courts is 0.26 percent.⁷ This rate is consistent with NCSC data from the previous three years.⁸
- The percentage of *tort* cases resolved by jury trial in state courts is 1.7 percent.⁹ This rate is consistent with NCSC data from the previous three years.¹⁰
- The percentage of *medical malpractice* cases resolved through jury trial in state courts is 6.4 percent.¹¹ This rate is consistent with NCSC data from the previous three years.¹²
